Week 47, Sunday (Nov 15) Acts 18-21

- 1. Who did Paul meet at Corinth (Acts 18:2) and what was their trade (Acts 18:3)? <u>Aquila and Priscilla, tent</u> <u>makers</u>
- 2. Who as Crispus? *ruler of the synagogue* Acts 18:8
- 3. How long was Paul at Corinth? *a year and 6 months* (Acts 18:11)
- 4. T F Appollos taught accurately the things of the Lord. <u>**TRUE**</u> (Acts 18:25) Who taught Appollos "more accurately"? <u>Aquila and Priscilla</u> 18:26
- 5. Into what were the 12 men Paul met in Ephesus baptized before he baptized them in the name of the Lord Jesus? <u>''Into John's baptism.'' Acts 19:3</u>
- 6. What unusual miracles did God work by the hands of Paul, according to Acts 19:12? <u>so that even handkerchiefs</u> or aprons were brought from his body to the sick, and the diseases left them and the evil spirits went out of them.
- 7. T F The magicians who became Christians sold their books of magic for over 50,000 pieces of silver. <u>FALSE</u> <u>Acts 19:19</u>
- 8. Why did Demetrius oppose Paul and the gospel? <u>saying that they are not gods which are made with hands.</u> ⁷ So not only is this trade of ours in danger of falling into disrepute, but also the temple of the great goddess Diana may be despised and her magnificence destroyed, whom all Asia and the world worship.'' Acts 19:26-27
- 9. Acts 20:17 From Miletus, Paul called for the <u>elders</u> of the church at Ephesus. In Acts 20:28, what did he call these men? <u>overseers, shepherds</u>
- 10. How long did Paul teach and preach at Ephesus? <u>3 years</u> 20:31
- 11. What did the disciples at Tyre tell Paul through the Spirit? *not to go up to Jerusalem* Acts 21:4
- 12. What did the prophet Agabus do in Paul's presence? <u>he took Paul's belt, bound his own hands and feet, and</u> said, "Thus says the Holy Spirit, 'So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man who owns this belt, and deliver him into the hands of the Gentiles.'" Acts 21:11
- 13. Who did the commander think Paul was (Acts 21:38)? <u>the Egyptian who some time ago stirred up a rebellion</u> and led the four thousand assassins out into the wilderness

Week 47, Monday (Nov 16) Acts 22-24

- 14. What did Paul say that upset the Jews at Jerusalem in Acts 22:21? <u>'Depart, for I will send you far from here to</u> the Gentiles.' ''
- 15. What did Paul say that made his examiners and the commander afraid (Acts 22:28)? *I was born a Roman citizen*

- 16. Who stood beside Paul and cheered him up, according to Acts 23:11? <u>the Lord stood by him Acts 23:11</u>
- 17. Who saved Paul from ambush of the 40 Jews intent on killing Paul (Acts 23:16)? *Paul's sister's son*
- 18. What was the name of the commander who saved Paul's life (twice), according to Acts 23:26? <u>*Claudius Lysias*</u> To whom did he send Paul? <u>governor Felix</u>
- 19. What were Christians called by Tertullus in Acts 24:5? the sect of the *Nazarenes*. What did Paul call this "sect" in Acts 24:14? <u>the Way</u>
- 20. Did Felix know about "the Way" (Acts 24:22)? Yes No <u>YES</u>
- 21. Why (Acts 24:25) did Felix tell Paul to "go away for now"? *Felix was afraid and answered, "Go away for now; when I have a convenient time I will call for you.*

Week 47, Tuesday (Nov 17) Acts 25-27

- 22. To whom did Paul appeal, rather than to be tried at Jerusalem (Acts 25:11)? <u>Caesar</u> Did Porcius Festus honor this request? Yes No <u>YES 25:12</u>
- 23. To whom did Festus send Paul for further examination (Acts 25:26)? <u>King Agrippa</u> Why (25:27)? <u>For it seems</u> to me unreasonable to send a prisoner and not to specify the charges against him."
- 24. T F Paul said of King Agrippa that he (Agrippa) was unfamiliar with Jewish customs. <u>FALSE 26:3</u>
- 25. Which Jewish sect did Paul say was the most strict (Acts 26:5)? *Pharisee*
- 26. T F Paul wanted to convert Agrippa to Christ. <u>TRUE 26:29</u>
- 27. What was the name of the centurion to which Paul was assigned, and how was Paul treated (27:1, 3)? <u>Julius</u>, <u>"Julius treated Paul kindly and gave him liberty to go to his friends and receive care" Acts 27:3</u>
- 28. T F Paul basically said "I told you so" to his shipmates in Acts 27:21. <u>TRUE</u>
- 29. Who stood beside Paul in Acts 27:23 and told him that none on-board would perish *an angel*

Week 47, Wednesday (Nov 18) Acts 28, Rom 1-2

- 30. After the shipwreck, to where did Paul and his shipmates escape? <u>Malta</u> How were they treated there? <u>the</u> <u>natives showed us unusual kindness; for they kindled a fire and made us all welcome Acts 28:2</u>
- 31. What promise of the Lord Jesus was fulfilled in Acts 28:6 (see also Mark 16:18)? <u>he shook off the creature into</u> <u>the fire and suffered no harm.</u> ⁶ However, they were expecting that he would swell up or suddenly fall down <u>dead. But after they had looked for a long time and saw no harm come to him, they changed their minds and</u> <u>said that he was a god</u> Acts 28:5-6
- 32. Name the citizen at Malta whose father was healed by Paul: *father of Publius 28:8*
- 33. T F Paul received "special" treatment as a prisoner in Rome. <u>TRUE 28:10</u>

34. With whom did Paul meet at Rome, in Acts 28:17? <u>the leaders of the Jews</u> What did they say about "the Way"? <u>We neither received letters from Judea concerning you, nor have any of the brethren who came</u> reported or spoken any evil of you. ²² But we desire to hear from you what you think; for concerning this sect, we know that it is spoken against everywhere." Acts 28:21-22

- 35. How long did Paul dwell in his own rented home at Rome (Acts 28:30)? <u>2 years</u>
- 36. T F Paul commended the Romans for their "famous" faith. Romans 1 <u>TRUE 1:8</u>
- 37. T F Paul's list of the unrighteousness done by those of a debased mind includes pride, disobedience to parents, being untrustworthy, being undiscerning, and approving of evil-doers. <u>*TRUE 1:29-32*</u>
- 38. What (Rom. 2:4) leads us to repentance? <u>the goodness of God leads you to repentance</u> Romans 2:4
- 39. What (Rom. 2:6-7) will God render to those who continue in doing good? <u>eternal life to those who by patient</u> <u>continuance in doing good seek for glory, honor, and immortality</u> <u>Romans 2:7</u>

Week 47, Thursday (Nov 19) Rom 3-6

- 40. T F All flesh will be justified by the Law (Romans 3:20). FALSE
- 41. Therefore we conclude that a man is *justified* by *faith* apart from the *deeds* of the *law. Romans 3:28*
- 42. What sign was the seal of the righteousness of Abraham's faith (Rom. 4:11)? *circumcision*
- 43. T F Abraham is your father. <u>*TRUE*</u>
- 44. Rom. 4:15 Where there is no *law* there is no *transgression*.
- 45. Rom. 5:6 "Christ died for the *ungodly*"
- 46. T F Death reigned from Adam to Abraham because of Adam's sin (Rom. 5:13,14). FALSE
- 47. Rom. 6:3 "...as many of us as were *baptized* into Christ Jesus were *baptized* into His *death.*"
- 48. T F The dead are slaves to sin (Rom. 6:7). *FALSE*

Week 47, Friday (Nov 20) Rom 7-9

- 49. Paul said to the Romans that they had become dead to <u>the law</u> through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another--to Him who was <u>raised from the dead</u>, that we should <u>bear fruit to God. Romans 7:4</u>
- 50. Rom. 8:5 "For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on *the things of the flesh*, but those who live according to the Spirit, *the things of the Spirit."*.
- 51. Rom. 8:18 "... the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the <u>glory</u> which shall be _ <u>revealed</u> in us."
- 52. Who intercedes for us in prayer (Rom. 8:26)? *the Spirit* Who else (Rom. 8:34) makes intercession for us? *Christ*
- 53. What/who has the power to separate us from God's love for us in Christ Jesus? <u>death nor life, nor angels nor</u> principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, Romans 8:38-39
- 54. According to Rom. 9:3, whom did Paul wish were accursed and for whom? <u>himself, his countrymen, the</u> <u>Israelites</u>
- 55. On whom will God have compassion? *will have compassion on whomever I will have compassion*. Rom. 9:15

56. Why did Israel *not* attain to the law of righteousness, Rom. 9:32? <u>Because they did not seek it by faith, but as it</u> were, by the works of the law. For they stumbled at that stumbling stone

Week 47, Saturday (Nov 21) Rom 10-12

- 57. T F For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, because of their knowledge. *FALSE 10:2*
- 58. "How beautiful are the **feet** of those who *preach the gospel of peace*, Who bring glad *tidings of good things*!" <u>Romans 10:15 (NKJV)</u>
- 59. T F But to Israel he says: "All day long I have stretched out My hands To a wonderful and loving people." *FALSE 10:21*
- 60. T F But what does the divine response say to him? "I have reserved for Myself seven thousand men who have not bowed the knee to Baal." <u>*TRUE*</u> Romans 11:4 (NKJV)
- 61. Do not boast against <u>the branches</u>. But if you do boast, remember that you do not support <u>the root</u>, but the <u>root</u> supports you Romans 11:18
- 62. For of Him and through Him and to Him are all things, to whom be glory forever. Amen. Romans 11:36
- 63. <u>I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy,</u> <u>acceptable to God, which is</u> your reasonable service. Romans 12:1 (NKJV)
- 64. T F Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good <u>TRUE</u> Romans 12:9

65. T F Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; ¹¹ not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the each other. <u>FALSE</u> Romans 12:10-11

66. Do not be overcome by evil, but *overcome evil with good* Romans 12:21
