Week 49, Sunday (Nov 29) II Cor 4-6

- 1. What did Paul say he was "always carrying about in the body"? The <u>dying</u> of the <u>Lord Jesus</u> (2 Cor. 4:10)
- 2. Please look at I Cor. 4:9-13 do these sound like "light" afflictions to you? According to 2 Cor. 4:17, did they seem light to Paul? Yes No <u>NO</u>
- 3. Paul said "we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed "with our *habitation* which is *from heaven* (2 Cor. 5:2)
- 4. What did Paul say God has given as a guarantee? *the Spirit* (2 Cor. 5:5)
- 5. Who did Paul say "must appear before the judgment seat of Christ"? we all must appear (2 Cor. 5:10)
- 6. When is the "accepted time" and the "day of salvation" referred to by God (Isa. 49:8)? <u>now</u> (2 Cor. 6:2)
- 7. Should your best friend be a non-Christian Yes No <u>NO</u> (2 Cor. 6:14)? Should a Christian marry a non-Christian? Yes No <u>NO</u>

Week 49, Monday (Nov 30) II Cor 7-10

- 8. How did God comfort Paul, and others, at Macedonia by the coming of Titus, the consolation with which he was comforted in you, your earnest desire, your mourning, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced even more. (2 Cor. 7:6-7)?
- 9. Why did Paul rejoice in the sorrow of the Corinthians *that their sorry led to repentance (in a godly manner)* (2 Cor. 7:9)?
- 10. T F The Macedonian churches, though very poor, gave liberally. **TRUE** (2 Cor. 8:1-2)
- 11. T F Titus, while unwilling, went to Corinth at Paul's request. <u>FALSE</u> (2 Cor. 8:17)

Week 49, Tuesday (Dec 1) II Cor 11-13

- 15. Who helped supply Paul's needs while he was at Corinth? *the brethren who came from Macedonia* (2 Cor. 11:9)
- 16. Paul said Satan transforms himself into an *angel of light* (2 Cor. 11:14)
- 17. What does Paul say he is doing in the last part of Chapter 11? **boasting** (II Cor. 11:18)
- 18. How many times had Paul received 38 stripes from the Jews? *five* How many times beaten with a rod? *three* Stoned? *once* How often shipwrecked? *three* (II Cor. 11:24)

- 19. In II Cor. 12, Paul "boasts" about a man he knows who, 14 years prior, was caught up to <u>the third heaven</u> and heard <u>inexpressable words</u>, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. (II Cor. 12:4)
- 20. To keep Paul from being exalted too much, a <u>thorn in the flesh</u> was given him a <u>messenger</u> of <u>Satan</u> (II Cor. 12:7).
- 21. T F God answered Paul's prayer to remove the "thorn in the flesh" <u>TRUE -He did not give the answer Paul wanted however</u> (II Cor. 12:9).

Week 49, Wednesday (Dec 2) Gal 1-3

- 25. Who wrote Galatians and to whom? *Paul to the church of Galatia* (Gal. 1:1-2)
- 26. T F The churches of Galatia had quickly turned away from Christ, to a "different gospel" *TRUE* (Gal. 1:6).
- 27. T F As an apostle, Paul had authority to present a revised, updated gospel to the Galatian churches <u>FALSE</u> (Gal. 1:8-9).
- 28. How did Paul receive the gospel of Christ? *the revelation of Jesus Christ* (Gal. 1:12)
- 29. To whom was the gospel for the uncircumcised committed? <u>to Paul</u> To whom was the gospel for the circumcised committed? <u>Peter</u> Gal. 2:7
- 30. Why did Paul confront Peter at Antioch? <u>before certain men came fro James, he would eat with the Gentiles;</u> <u>but whenthey came, he withdrew and seperated himself, fearing those who were of the circumcision.</u>

- 31. From what "curse" did Christ redeem us and how? <u>curse of the law, having become a curse for us (by dying on the tree)</u> (Gal. 3:13)
- 32. How many years passed between the covenant with Abraham and the law of Moses? <u>430 years</u> Gal. 3:17
- 33. The law was our *tutor* to bring us to Christ (Gal. 3:24).

Week 49, Thursday (Dec 3) Gal 4-6

- 34. Because of Paul's "physical infirmity", what did he say the Galatians would have been willing to do? <u>they would</u> have plucked out their own eyes and given them to Paul (Gal. 4:15)
- 35. T F "Do not cast out the bondwoman and her son, for the son of the bondwoman shall also be heir with the son of the freewoman." *FALSE* Gal 4:30
- 36. T F Paul taught the Galatians (Gal. 5:2-3,11) they should be circumcised. *FALSE*

Week 49, Friday (Dec 4) Eph 1-4

- 40. Who wrote Ephesians? *Paul* (Eph. 1:1)
- 41. 'When did God "choose us" to be holy and blameless before Him, adopted as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself? <u>before the foundation of the world</u> (Eph. 1:4-5)
- 42. With what/whom are we sealed as the guarantee of our inheritance? *the Holy Spirit of promise* (Eph. 1:13-14)
- 43. "...Even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by *grace you have been saved*)," Eph 2:5
- 44. T F But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

- 45. Through whom were all things created? *Christ* (Eph. 3:9)

- 47. To whom did Paul "bow his knees"? to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ (Eph. 3:14)
- 48. "...to Him be glory in *the church* by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Eph. 3:21
- 49. Paul encouraged the Ephesians to endeavor to keep the <u>unity</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> in the <u>bond</u> of <u>peace</u> (Eph. 4:3)
- 50. Jesus gave diverse gifts and responsibilities for the edifying of the <u>body</u> of <u>Christ</u> Eph. 4:11-12
- 51. Eph. 4:26-7 "Be <u>angry</u> and do not <u>sin</u> Do not let the sun go down on your wrath, nor give place to the devil".
- 52. Let no <u>corrupt word</u> proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for <u>necessary edification</u> that it may impart <u>grace</u> to the hearers. Eph. 4:29

Week 49, Saturday (Dec 5) Eph 5-6, Phil 1

- 53. Eph. 5:30, we are members of Christ's **body** of His **flesh** and of His **bones**
- 54. The "whole armor of God" consists of: The girding of the waist with <u>truth</u> the breastplate of <u>righteousness</u> the shoes of the <u>preparation</u> of the <u>gospel</u> of <u>peace</u> above all, the shield of <u>faith</u> the helmet of <u>salvation</u> and the sword of the <u>Spirit</u> which is the <u>Word</u> of <u>God</u> (Eph. 6:14-17)
- 55. Being thus armored, we must (be) <u>praying</u> always with all <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u> in the <u>Spirit</u> being <u>watchful</u> to this end with all <u>perseverance</u> and <u>supplication</u> for all the <u>saints</u> ..." Eph. 6:18
- 56. In Phil. 1:1, Paul addresses "all the *saints in Christ Jesus*" who are in Philippi, with the *bishops and deacons*
- 57. Paul told those in Philippi, "I have you in my *heart* (Phil. 1:7).
- 58. T F Paul rejoiced in the preaching of Christ, even when done in pretense <u>TRUE</u> (Phil. 1:18).
- 59. Paul wanted to hear about the Philippians that they "stand fast in <u>one spirit</u> with <u>one mind</u> striving together for the *faith* of the *gospel.*" (Phil. 1:27)
